Update on WRCTC's Operations

We are gearing up for the 2016 construction season! We have Fiber-to-the-Home (FTTH) projects in the Newell, Buffalo and Bison areas planned for 2016. We have received the majority of easements for the Newell and Buffalo FTTH projects and we will be sending easements out for the FTTH project east of Bison the beginning of April.

As the warmer weather approaches and construction starts up again, I would like to take a moment to remind you to call 811 before you dig. It takes one phone call to prevent a fiber optic cable from being damaged and a telecommunications outage. Fiber optic cuts can take several hours to repair 376-5236 and cost thousands of dollars. Please call 811 before you begin any projects that require digging.

In the beginning of March, cost consultants, Paul Nesenson and Gordon Dauchy, from JSI, Eagan, MN visited WRCTC to review our 797-4667 2016 cost study and discussed future Universal Service Fund (USF) impacts to WRCTC. JSI is a full-service consulting firm that provides high-quality financial, management, regulatory and strategic assistance to WRCTC.

KBJM Farm & Home Show



FUSC to Decrease

West River Cooperative Telephone members will see an decrease in the monthly Federal Universal Service Charge (FUSC) on their 866-4605 telephone bill effective April 1, 2016.

Residential and single line businesses will decrease from \$1.55 to \$1.52 (.03 cent decrease). Multiple line businesses will decrease from \$2.22 to \$2.18 (.04 cent decrease). Also, all members with DSL, which is high speed Internet, will see their FUSC rate decrease from \$5.38 to \$5.29 (.09 cent decrease) per month. These rates are calculated by the FCC and we are required to implement the increases or decreases accordingly.
