## WE TAKE COPYRIGHT Infringement SERIOUSLY

**Downloading** copyrighted materials without permission of the copyright holder is against the law!

It is illegal to download copyrighted materials, such as music, movies and games, through filesharing software. A good way to think of it is if you didn't pay for it, you have obtained it illegally.

When West River Cooperative Telephone Company receives a notice from a copyright holder or its authorized representative regarding an alleged violation of law by someone using an IP address identified as belonging to West River Cooperative Telephone Company, we are obligated by law to notify the customer of the infringement by telephone and e-mail. If it is a first time offense, the customer will be notified and advised that an alleged violation of copyright law has been received and that any further violations could affect the customer's access to the internet. Notification of a second offense will result in the same action. A third offense may result in notice that internet service will be restricted for ninety (90) days to limit the ability to violate the law. A fourth offense may result in the termination of internet service, unless instructed otherwise by federal law or copyright holder.

## **Federal Universal Service Charges to Increase**

West River Cooperative Telephone Company members will see an increase in the monthly Federal Universal Service Charge (FUSC) on their telephone bill effective September 1, 2024. A Federal Communications Commission (FCC) order changed the way telephone companies can recover their Federal Universal Fund contributions. The Federal Universal Service Fund Program is designed to help keep local telephone service rates affordable for all customers, in all areas of the United States.

Residential and single line businesses will increase from \$2.13 to \$2.24 (.11 cent increase). Multiple line businesses will increase from \$4.00 to \$4.20 (.20 cent increase). Please keep in mind that if you bundle your residential services, you do not see these charges as they are included in your flat bundle fee. Just one more reason to bundle!
